2.	Approval of Minutes from last meeting (26th January 2022): Minutes were approved. Proposed by Frances Ross (FR) seconded by Carol Walker-Lyon (CWL).	
3.	Matters Arising: All relevant matters from previous meeting have been completed. Details outlined in agenda items below.	
4.	Welcome & Introductions Jill McIntyre (JM) welcomed everyone to the meeting. The actions from the last group have all been taken forward. JM reminded the Committee that we have agreed to have a joint AGM on the 15 th June with the Parent Council which is a good opportunity to signal the great work that's carried out by both groups and encourage new volunteers. CM confirmed that Michael Cockburn is available to attend.	
5.	School Update Kirsty Martin (KM) provided an update on the current restrictions within the school. A whole school letter will be issued on 24th March and the headlines of that would be:	
	 Photographer has been booked for school photographs. Due to the limited availability/choices of school approved photographers its likely that individual photos and family photos will be able to be completed but not class photos. A P7 all class photograph would be prioritised if possible. There was discussion about the quality of the photographs in 2021 and exploring other more creative options. KM noted the feedback. Preparations for the P7 show continue. Venue likely to be Blackhall Church hall and likely to be a matinee and an evening performance. KM and the school are progressing quotes for the Astroturf project. The Quarry behind the school is owned by two separate parties. There are some trees that are causing concern over the school grounds and whilst discussing this with the owners one offered to sponsor some of the activity. The owner also agreed to create some timelapse footage of the trees coming down which would be appreciated by the children. Parent Consultations were in progress and KM was hopeful of a return to face to face meetings in the future although some parents have expressed a preference for virtual meetings to continue. 	Carol

- The school have been discussing what additional charitable things could be done to support Ukraine and recognise the challenges. The sunflower is a symbol of peace and it's been agreed to host a whole school art afternoon to portray sunflowers in a variety of ways. Children will be invited to come to school on the 8th April dressed in blue or yellow if they are able. The council and schools are preparing lists of any current pupil vacancies.
- Easter Assembly logistics continue to be worked through due to the ongoing requirement for adults to socially distance in a hall environment.
- The new website is now live and there is a redirect in place from the old website currently. There is a section for the PSA and Parent Council to add information and Mr Taylor will be coordinating content.

6. Financial Position

7. PSA Update

The recent coffee morning raised £187 in donations with a few donations made to the fundraising link. The feedback was overwhelmingly positive from

both parents and the children who attended to support. The drop in format seems to work well and the uniform swap option also worked. We discussed the option of using the school but it was felt that a local venue offered a different aspect to the event. The ASN reps have been asked to suggest any additional items that the PSA need to consider for future events. JM will confirm the final date of the school year and any logistical support needed.

8. Football & Library Updates

CWL updated the Committee on the Football season. There is c£1000 left post fees. ESMS have been in touch to cancel the booking for the indoor hall. CWL is exploring other options with Mattie from Active Schools about improving facility access. It's a challenging issue to resolve due to the large number of kids, parent supervision and space availability. There was a lower uptake on P1 attendance this year, perhaps due to COVID overhang, and JY asked that we continue to promote and see if extra attendance can be generated.

KM confirmed that school lets can now be applied for so that might be an option for the earlier time slots.

There was also some feedback about the quality of the Astro pitches at Mary Erskine and the need for some upgrading and goals not being allowed to be used.

CWL confirmed that as yet no one had taken up the opportunity for subsidised coaching.

CWL confirmed that herself and Susan had been able to visit the school and start to tidy up the library. There are a number of old books needing to be removed and a book give away will be held outside the school. CWL thinks it will sort itself out once classes get into the rhythm of a rota with checking books in and out but until then quite a significant amount of time is needed to
