Kirsty update	 Finance meeting to be put in the diary Outdoor learning progressing in school P7s getting ready for camp next week Main items of funding requested are: Panto request Playground equipment; and potentially Royal Highland Show but need to consider and need to book buses for whole school sooner this time All attendees were supportive of the main requests Foreign student programme with students attending the school for a couple of days – school gets £20 per person for attendance and could make c.£400 which would go to Panto funding Astro – is this where we want to target fundraising? – last quote £140k+. PSA plans	 FR outlined the plan of events for the year with proposed dates: Autumn Fair - 30/9 Halloween discos – 27/10 Parents Xmas social – Dec – TBC Magic show – 24/31 January Spring disco – 22/3 P7 School Show – 26/3 Race night – 26/4 Summer Raffle – Jun-24 Claire Yates noted we couldn't get a company to do the race night so maybe just having a night out instead All other dates/ideas supported with future meetings to focus on next events 		
Autumn Fair	 FR outlined plans School Let put in for Fri eve for set up and Saturday all day for Big hall, small hall and kitchen Proposed timings are 11am-2pm on 30/9 Donation request for the stalls to be circulated by groups Stalls to be manned and organised via the wider school to get shifts on the stalls (c.2 hours each) Local business to be offered to come along – let FR know NR ran through who had volunteered for each stall and what was still available; FR noted there will be a sign-up sheet at meet the teacher on 6/9 Animal man requires money (£280) – was done recently and was busy some people couldn't get in. FR Entry fee suggestion of £1 per person; CY suggested donations only rather than minimum entry as some people are more generous FR asked KM and AG if we can involve the kids from school; KM noted that would be great with sweets in the jar and name the bear good ideas but will put it to the P6/7 kids on what they want to do. KM said there is a spare room in the hut to be utilised CL – candy floss nice to have, but a bit messy, could bag up pre fair; KM has a popcorn make that is available to use
AOB	 Class reps amendments - Erin Mason now rep for P2; Laura Briggs volunteered to be P1 rep along with Eilidh Scott. No volunteers for Parent Council PSA Rep Earth calling - KM noted earth calling is after school and still happens. Wildlife rangers/outdoor classroom part of school day which PSA supported via the school. School has a member of staff to now support, outdoor curriculum now in sync with indoor curriculum and year planned out. Cost is free and with budget cuts it made sense or justify the additional spend when it can be done in-house.
