Aims of **Speak out. Stay safe.**

Speak out. Stay safe. online fits with the Articles of the UNCRC and the Curriculum for Excellence: Health and Wellbeing – Experiences and Outcomes (a Curriculum Links Document will be provided with this resource).

The programme aims to help children understand:

- abuse in all its forms and how to recognise the signs of abuse
- that abuse is never a child's fault and they have the right to be safe
- where to get help and the sources of help available to them, including our [Childline service](#).

Content of **Speak out. Stay safe.**

This virtual resource is available for P1-3 (5-7yrs) and P4-7 (7-11yrs) pupils. It includes child-friendly interactive video presentations (that can be delivered by teachers to individual classes or to larger assembly groups) in addition to the provision of supporting classroom resources.
