

Literacy


- We will continue to use the Edinburgh Literacy Rich Programme to deliver Literacy.
- New sounds will be introduced on Mondays and these will be shared on the weekly homework.
- We will practise reading and writing words and sentences with these sounds in them.
- We will develop our cursive handwriting, linking this to the weekly sounds.





Writing - Drawing Club

- We have weekly writing lessons, called "Drawing Club".
- These sessions develop writing, sparks ideas and develop the childrens understanding of character and setting.
- We introduce new vocabulary each week and teach actions to go alongside each new word.
- We can incorporate letters, numbers and words we have learned into our pictures.
- We also have the chance to discuss our ideas and share them in a small group.



Helicopter Stories

Helicopter Stories give children the opportunity to come up with their own stories to have scribed. Within the same day they have the opportunity to act out their stories with their peers.

Helicopter stories develops:

- talking and listening
- creativity
- ideas for writing
- confidence when performing for an audience.

Meta Skills

Meta-skills are innate, timeless, higher-order skills that create adaptive learners and promote success in whatever context the future brings. We will be learning about each Meta=Skill and the children wil be encouraged to recognise these skills throughout their day.



Reading

Our goal: to spark an interest in reading, storytelling and books.

- We use books to support the sounds being learned in class, as well as those linked to the children's interests and tastes.
- It's not just being able to read that is important! We also focus on skills such
 as sharing opinions, predicting events, sequencing stories and retelling them!
 These all show a deeper understanding of what we are reading and help us
 develop our creativity!

Numeracy: SEAL Programme




